Accreditation of Degree Programmes

At a recent meeting on 11 March 2025 the Royal Society of Chemistry Committee for Accreditation and Validation agreed to accept for accreditation;

> Bachelor of Science Honours in Chemical Science Graduateship in Chemistry

The Committee highlighted many commendations during the accreditation review, these are detailed in the report but particularly praised the funding for the new Malabe development, external examiner system and the strong links with other institutions.

There are some requirements that need to be met within 12 months of accreditation being granted (by March 2026); the Committee have requested you share the finalised unit structure that is due to be implemented and provide information about the electives and two laboratory courses on Level 4 that will be implemented in the curriculum.

The Committee have also highlighted a number of recommendations, which are not compulsory but would improved the programme and student learning experience. These are outlined in the report.

The Royal Society of Chemistry should be notified of any subsequent changes in the structure or content of this programme for your degrees to remain accredited.

Attached to this letter is the accreditation assessment report. Your certificate will be sent in the post next week.
