

The title of the extended abstract

The extended abstract should be between 1000-1500 words (Number of pages 2-3).

Authors' names and affiliations should not appear on the extended abstract.

1. Introduction

Introduction should explain the necessary background, importance, and prior work related to the study.

2. Methods and Materials

This section should explain all the methods and chemicals that have been performed / used for the study. If instrumentation is used, all the conditions that have been used during the analyses should be specified.

3. Results and Discussion

This section should explain the results obtained and provide detailed discussion giving due reference to the relevant literature. Figures and tables may be used to elaborate the data. They should be referred to as Fig. 1 and Table 1, respectively.

4. Conclusion

Conclusion should explain the implication of the finding/s. It is important to indicate the limitation/s and future directions that the data directed at.

5. References

Include only the essential references that have been used for the study. The references should be cited in the text as superscript numbers. All the references should be in the ACS style (see below).
